

A Little History: May to November Election

Even though Scottsville is an independent town, it still falls under the jurisdiction of Federal and State Code or law. To add to this, Virginia is a Dillons Rule state which gives the Virginia legislature control over local govenment policy and code. During the 2021 session the General Assembly voted to move all elections in the

Scottsville votes for three candidates on Nov. 8. Two candidates are on the ballot with three write-in candidates that the James Exchange is aware of. On the ballot are R. Daniel Gritsko and Meredith C. Hynes. The write-in candidates are Austyn Bessette, Bill Hyson, and Stuart Munson.

The James Exchange has reached out to candidates for an opportunity to answer the following five questions:

- 1. What is driving you to be on town council?
- 2. Are you a team player, or do you see yourself as a "lone wolf"?

3. What are you willing to do to ensure the town is welcoming to newcomers and visitors while being respectful of our business owners?

4. Do you think we should have a conversation about business owners in the town but do not reside here, have voting rights? (Of course, we know State Code and Dillon's Rule restrict this, but think outside the box).

5. Where do you see the town in 20 years?

Each candidate was given the deadline of November 1st to record a podcast session with The James Exchange. Individual candidate podcasts will go live on November 5th and 6th and will be presented in alphabetical order. Even though all candidates, on ballot and write-in, have been given equal time to participate with questions given to them in advance, not all have responded before this went to print.

And, A Little More Background

The Town of Scottsville elections used to have all six seats for Council and Mayor on the ballot for a two-year term. A change in the Town Charter created staggered terms for Council. Those elected now serve for fouryears. In the 2020 election, the Mayor and the top three vote getters started their four-year term. (Mayor Ron Smith, Councilors Alex Bessette*, Zach Bullock, and Eddie Payne). And the bottom three vote getters are up for election this year. (Councilors Dan Gritsko, Meredith Hynes*, and Bill Hyson*). The three elected in the November 8th election will serve through 2026. The next Town election will be in 2024. (*Serving out vacancies).

The James Exchange: Who We Are

The James Exchange is a podcast based on conversations that bring issues and community happenings to light. Our first episode was on the 2021 Scottsville parade with Phyliss Johnson. To date, over 100 episodes have aired with subjects from conversations with our younger generation to elected officials.

The name was selected because the James River has been an enduring feature in our area during good times and not so good times. It is everchanging and yet a stabilizing force. This more or less defines the first year of the James Exchange. Our fomatting continues to evolve and will continue to do so.
